However, the best winter activities are found in Estonia's wild nature. Frozen bogs, snow-covered pine trees, and icy beaches will make you feel like you've stepped onto another planet and are all yours to explore.



Snowshoe hike

Hiking in a bog is a wonderful way to discover the Estonian wilderness, enjoy some fresh and clean air and get some exercise. Another thing that makes bogshoe hikes quite unique is the fact that they take place year-round and with any weather.




Kicksled hike

Fat bike hike

Fatbike is a bicycle with extra-wide tires designed for riding on soft, uneven ground, such as a forest trail, snow, sand or mud. Thanks to such tires, fatbikes can be used all year round.

Winter fatbike tours offer a unique and adventurous way to explore the wintry landscapes of various destinations. These tours typically involve riding fat-tire bicycles, specially designed for snowy terrain, through snow-covered trails and paths.

Winter kiteboarding


